

Kelly's Directory Extract 1915 Colerne



COLERNE is a parish and village adjoining the Gloucestershire and Somersetshire borders, 2 miles north from Box station, on the Swindon and Bath section of the Great Western railway, 8 west-south west from Chippenham, and 6 north-east from Bath, in the North Western division of the county, Chippenham hundred, petty sessional division, union and county court district, and in the Chippenham rural deanery, North Wilts archdeaconry, and Bristol diocese. The great Roman road, called the "Fossway", from Bath to Cirencester, passes on the north. The church of St John the Baptist is an ancient and very beautiful building of stone in the Late Norman and subsequent styles, consisting of chancel with chantry, nave of 4 bays, aisles, south porch, and a fine Perpendicular embattled western tower with pinnacles, containing a clock and 8 bells: on the north wall of the sanctuary are 3 sedilia with 14th century canopies, restored and replaced in 1903: some remains of a Saxon cross, and a fragment of a reredos are preserved in the church, which was thoroughly restored in 1875, under the direction of Mr Wilcox, architect of Bath, at a cost of £4000, chiefly contributed by the late Richard Walmsley esq. and the late William Poynder esq.: there are sittings for 400 persons. The register dates from the year 1560. The living is a rectory, net yearly income £230, with residence, in the gift of New College, Oxford, and held since 1905, by the Rev Hippisley Stephens MA of New College, Oxford. Here are Congregational, Baptist, and two Primitive Methodist chapels. Charities of the yearly value of about £16, derived from bequests, left in trust for the deserving poor, are distributed at the discretion of the rector and trustees: there are also 25 acres of charity land, at present bestowed free in allotments of half an acre, to the second poor of the parish: the management of this charity has been modified by the Charity Commissioners. Brown's charity produces about £6 yearly and is managed by the rector and churchwardens. Lucknam, with a park, is the seat of John Walmsley esq JP, who is lord of the manor of Euridge; the Warden and Fellows of New College, Oxford, are lords of the manor of Colerne. The principal landowners are J Walmsley esq. JP, Lord Islington, PC, GCMG, DSO, Darcy Edmund Taylor esq. JP, and the Warden and Fellows of New College, Oxford. The soil is corn brash, sub-soil, rock. The chief crops are wheat, barley and roots. The area is 3928 acres, rateable value £4569: population in 1911, 939.

Euridge, an ancient manor, 2 miles north-east, consists of a farmhouse and 3 cottages. Eastrip, half a mile east, Thickwood, 1 mile north-east, and Widdenham, 1.5 miles east, on the Box Brook, are hamlets.
