



## Compton Bassett Flower Show

### Where Quality Excels

Compton Bassett's annual show and sports - the 11th of the series - held on Wednesday afternoon in ideal weather, proved the attractive and pleasing function it always is.

The entries for the horticultural show were slightly down, but even so they numbered about 250, with only about eight fewer exhibitors. The season is largely responsible for the decrease.

The show is held under the presidency of Captain G. H. Benson, of Compton Bassett House, with Mr. Henry Welch as its capable Secretary, who has held that post since the show started 11 years ago. was Mr. F. Rumming was the sports secretary this year, in place of Mr. J. Eattwell, and Mr. W. J. Sainsbury was honorary treasurer. The Committees assisting these officials were [recorded in the table below]

An invaluable assistant whose name does not appear those of the Committee was Mr. H. M. Friend (the Mayor of Marlborough).

The judges were Mr. J. Knight (gardener at Bowood), and Mr. J. Green (gardener to Mr. P. Redman). Mrs. Clem Cole and Miss Maslen judged the cooked potatoes, wild flowers, preserved fruit and cakes, while Mr. H. Spyers judged the eggs and honey. Mr. J. Buckle and Mr. H. Slade, both of Chippenham, adjudicated in the sports events.

There were two non-competitive exhibits, both of which came in for a good deal of favourable comment. One was a collection of vegetables, which consisted of 12 varieties, sent by Captain Benson (gardener Mr. H. Welch), and the other a beautiful collection of dahlias sent by Mr. A. E. Hooper of Marlborough.

Compton Bassett and surrounding exhibitors could give a lead to many more important shows in the quality of their exhibits. There were six entries in the class for cottages' collections of vegetables; six varieties were necessary and some of them included vegetables which would easily have won in individual classes. Onions were good, but tomatoes were truly excellent.

In the long carrots class, Mr. Coleman's first prize winning exhibit was outstanding above those of the other two prize winners. Peas were good for the season, but fruit as a whole was poorly represented, a fact for which the season is entirely responsible. Besides carrots, Mr. Coleman sent in fine collections of dahlias and gladioli, which won first prize.
