Compton Bassett

Compton Bassett is a small parish and rural village in the Northern division of the county, Calne hundred, union and county court district, diocese of Salisbury, archdeaconry of Wilts, and rural deanery of Avebury, 2½ miles north-east from Calne, and 8 south from Wootton Bassett.

The church of St Swithin is in the Norman and Perpendicular styles, with chancel, nave, aisles and tower with 5 bells, and rich stone Tudor rood-screen. The chancel has been rebuilt, and a stained glass window inserted in memory of the late rector. The register dates from 1558. The living is a rectory, yearly value £560, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury, and held by the Rev. John William Clarke, M.A. of Sidney Sussex College, Cambridge.

Here is a good mixed National school, with residence for the master and mistress.

Compton House, with extensive park and pleasure grounds, is the seat of George Heneage Walker Heneage, esq., J.P., who is lord of the manor and the principal landowner.

The soil is chalky; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley and turnips. The area is 2,632 acres; rateable value, £4,414; the population in 1871 was 357.
