



## *In The News*

### *Compton Chamberlayne*

The Foresters and Oddfellows of this neighbourhood had a fete on 28<sup>th</sup> ult., in Compton Park. The attendance was not so numerous as would otherwise have been on account of the attractions offered at Wilton on the same day. About 1,200 persons were present, including the New Sarum Lodge of Oddfellows and the Egerton and Wyndham Court of Foresters. The Salisbury Promenade Band and the Fovant Brass Band played during the day. In the afternoon there was pony racing. The Compton Park Plate, value five guineas, was run for in heats with the following results: 1<sup>st</sup>, Mr Jane's Hannah; 2<sup>nd</sup>, Mr Hinton's Black Tom; 3<sup>rd</sup>, Mr C. Mayo's Waterloo. This was followed by the first part of the concert given by the Black Star Ministrels. The Race for the Dinton Cup, value two guineas, resulted in a victory for Mr Futcher's Lady Elizabeth, Mr Hinton's Black Tom being second. The Consolation Cup was won by Mr Hinton's Black Tom, Mr Tom Stone's Dick Turpin being a good second. The racing was considered to be far above the average. Foot racing for several prizes followed, and during the evening dancing and other amusements were indulged in.
