

## Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Coombe Bisset



COOMBE BISSET is a parish in the Hundred of Cawden and Cadworth, and Alderbury Poor Law Union, Wilton parliamentary borough, South Wilts, 3 ½ miles south-west from Salisbury station, 98 ½ from London; contained, in 1851, 415 inhabitants, and 2,196 acres. The living is a vicarage, in the archdeaconry and diocese of Salisbury, valued at £220. The Rev. William Biscoe, M.A., is the incumbent. The church is dedicated to St. Michael. Here is a small National school.

POST OFFICE. - William Brooks, receiver. Letters arrive by messenger from Salisbury at 7 a.m.; are dispatched at 7 p.m. The nearest money order office is at Salisbury.
