

Chippenham v. Corsham

A match was played between these two clubs on Thursday the 14th inst., on the Chippenham ground, and terminated in an easy victory for Corsham. The Chippenham players were most unfortunate in this game, and, with the exception of Woodbourne and Huff, could not stand against the superior bowling of their opponents. In the second innings the wickets fell with great rapidity, and at the fall of the last only 15 runs were scored. The bowling of Edgecombe on the Corsham side was excellent, and on the Chippenham side, Woodbourne, in the first innings, delivered some capital balls and took no less than 6 wickets. Chippenham, in the first innings, scored 45; second innings, 15. Corsham, 1st innings, 61; second innings, 115.
