

Wilts Special Commission

Saturday (Before Mr. Justice Alderson, in the Council-Chamber.)

Thomas Ockerell, indicted for an assault on William Poulton, a special constable of Cricklade St. Sampson, was acquitted, the charge, not being proved against him.

William Goddard, Edward Ricks, Thomas Kilmington, John Giles, Joseph Cully, John Drew, Thomas Hicks, William Giles, Henry Buckland, Robert Shurmer, and Thomas Ockerell, charged with riot on the 23rd of November, at the parish of Cricklade St. Sampson, pleaded guilty, and were discharged upon entering into their own recognizances of £50 each, to keep the peace for two years, and to appear and receive judgement when called upon.
