



DEVIZES CORN MARKETS 1847

At the opening of the market, the farmers demanded much more money for Wheat than last week, which greatly checked business. In some instances an advance of 2s. a sack was, how-ever obtained, but the supply being large, the trade ruled heavy, and the few sales effected towards the close, *may* be stated at an improvement of 1s a sack. Two lots of Wheat, of 12 score 15 nett, sold at 55s. the sack.

The trade in Barley is now scarcely worth noticing. - Prices may be stated nominally as last week, --- Beans were in good demand, at 15d a sack advance – the high price of 30s, having been obtained. But little doing in Peas, the holder asking 1s, a sack more money.
