



GREAT WESTERN RAILWAY TIME TABLE

The special service of trains on the Reading and Holt line, as advertised by us last week, came to an end on Friday, and on Saturday the regular service began as per time table. We beg to call the attention of our readers who travel by rail to the fact that there is more or less alteration in the time of almost every train to and from Devizes, the most notable being the first and second down trains from London are each about one hour earlier than heretofore. Other trains are altered three, five or ten minutes. There is "a revision of fares," also, on this and the neighbouring branches, the chief point of which is the establishment of a regular third class fare, at about 1¼d. per mile by nearly all trains, there being only one each way, run as parliamentary, at 1d per mile. The first and second class fares are also raised to Weymouth, Frome, Warminster, Salisbury, Bath, Bristol and stations between. There are no alterations in fares from Devizes to stations on the Great Western main line between London and Chippenham.
