The names of 29 members of the Oddfellows Society are inscribed on the above memorial all of whom gave their lives for King and Country during WWI.

**ARCHARD, HERBERT ERNEST -** Private 6892 - 70th Company, Machine Gun Corps - Died 29th March 1916 - Age 24 - Born in Bradford on Avon; Enlisted at Trowbridge; Resident of Calne - Son of Albert E. and Sarah A. Archard of Calne - Buried at Ecoivres Military Cemetery, Mont-St. Eloi, Pas de Calais, France; Grave/Memorial Reference - I. C. 14

**ASHLEY, ALFRED -** Sergeant 204225 - 6th Battalion Wiltshire Regiment - Died 23rd March 1918 - Born in Easterton; Enlisted at Devizes; Resident of Devizes - Commemorated on the Arras Memorial, Pas-de-Calais, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - Bay 7

**AXFORD, W. V. -** Private 12482 - 5th Battalion Wiltshire Regiment - Died 25th January 1917 - Buried at Amara War Cemetery, Iraq - Grave/Memorial Reference - XVIII. E. 11

**BURNETT, REGINALD H.** - Private 19648 - 9th Battalion Cameronians (Scottish Rifles) - Died 7th May 1917 of wounds - Age 26 - Born in Easterton; Enlisted in Devizes; Son of Henry and Beatrice Burnett of the Post Office, Easterton; Reginald also served as Private 94531, Royal Horse and Royal Field Artillery - Buried at Niederzwehren Cemetery, Hessen, Germany - Grave/Memorial Reference - IX. E. 11.

**BUTLER, REGINALD ALBERT -** Rifleman 315215 - London Regiment, Rifle Brigade posted to 2nd/11th Battalion London Regiment - Died 16th August 1917 - Age 25 - Born in Chippenham; Enlisted at Paddingington, London. Middlesex; Resident of Mayfair, London, Middlesex; Son of George and Maria Butler of Foghamshire, Chippenham - Commemorated on the Ypres (Menin Gate) Memorial, Ieper, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium - Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 52 and 54

**CARTER, ROBERT WILLIAM -** Private 38981 - 2nd/6th Battalion Lancashire Fusiliers - Died 10th July 1917 - Born in Chippenham; Enlisted at Chippenham - Buried at Coxyde Military Cemetery, Koksijde, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium - Grave/Memorial Reference - I. E. 22.

**DOBSON, WILLIAM THOMAS -** Sapper 204154- 490 Field Company, Royal Engineers - Died 9th June 1916 of wounds - Age 37 - Born in Marlborough; Enlisted in Marlborough; Son of Thomas and Rebecca Dobson; Husband of Helen Dobson of 11 Hyde Lane, Marlborough - Buried in Terlincthun British Cemetery, Wimille, Pas de Calais, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - XVII F. 9.

**EDWARDS, ROBERT HERBERT HENRY -** Private 68831 - 2nd Battalion Devonshire Regiment - died 31st May 1918 - Age 19 - Born in Urchfont; Enlisted at Devizes; son of Mr. and Mrs. R. Edwards, The Smithy, Urchfont - Commemorated on the Soissons Memorial, Aisne, France

**HATTER, ALFRED CHARLES -** Private 59320 - Depot. Northumberland Fusiliers - Died 2nd August 1918 - Age 24 - Born in Great Bedwyn; Enlisted Pewsey; Son of George and Alice Hatter of Great Bedwyn; Husband of Emily Hatter of Southcott Road, Pewsey - Buried in Great Bedwyn (St. Mary) Churchyard, Great Bedwyn - Grave/Memorial Reference - 487

**HELPS, EDWIN -** Rifleman 5619 - 8th Battalion London Regiment (Post Office Rifles) - Died 15th December 1916 - Age 38 - Born in Rowde; Enlisted at Swindon; Resident of Wootton Bassett; Husband of Mrs. Edith Helps of 2 Manor Cottage, Kington Langley - Buried at Wood Cemetery, Ieper, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium - Grave/Memorial Reference - VI. A. 1.

**HILLIER, CHARLES WILLIAM -** Lance Corporal 7604 - D Company, 1st Battalion Royal Berkshire Regiment - Died 19th September 1914 - Age 32 - Born in Calne; Enlisted at Maidenhead, Berkshire; Resident of Reading, Berkshire; Son of the late Henry and Sarah Hillier of Yatesbury; Husband of the late Ada Phoebe Hillier - Commemorated on the La Ferte-Sous-Jouarre Memorial, Seine-et-Marne, France

**HUTCHINS/HUTCHINGS, HENRY -** Private 1809 - C. Company, 2/4th Battalion Wiltshire Regiment - Died 6th April 1916 - Age 22 - Born in Preshute; Enlisted at Marlborough; Resident of Marlborough; Son of Mr. Edward. and Mrs. Sarah A. Hutchins of 2 Tan Yard, London Road, Marlborough; brother of William Edward Hutchins who also gave his life for his country - Commemorated on the Basra Memorial, Iraq - Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 30 and 64.

**HUTCHINS/HUTCHINGS, WILLIAM EDWARD** - Private 200685 - D. Company, 1/4th (TF) Battalion Duke of Edinburgh's Wiltshire Regiment - Died 10th April 1918 - Age 26 - Born in Marlborough; Enlisted at Durrington; Resident of Marlborough; Son of Edward and Sarah a. Hutchins of 2 Tan Yard, London Road, Marlborough; Brother of Henry Hutchins who also gave his life for his country - Buried at Ramleh War Cemetery, Israel - Grave/Memorial Reference - R75

**KIMBER/KIMMER, JAMES** - Private 241883 - 2nd Battalion Suffolk Regiment - Died 22nd December 1917 - Age 33 - Born in Lockeridge; Enlisted at Marlborough; Son of George and Jane Kimmer Of Lockeridge; Husband of Mrs. E. Kimmer of Overton - Buried at Achiet-Le-Grand Communal Cemetery Extension, Pas-de-Calais, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - Grave II. D. 16

MARCHANT, ARTHUR HENRY - Lance Corporal 306279 - 2/7th Battalion Royal Warwickshire Regiment - Died 5th December 1917 - Born in Marlborough; Enlisted in Marlborough - Commemorated on the Cambrai Memorial, Louverval, Nord, France

**WILLIS, ROBERT -** Private 306694 - 1st/8th Territorial Battalion, Royal Warwickshire Regiment - Died 4th October 1917- Age 39 - Born in Urchfont; Enlisted at Devizes; Resident of Urchfont; Son of James and Jane Willis of Peppercumbe, Urchfont - Commemorated on the Tyne Cot Memorial, West Vlaanderen, Belgium - Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 23-28 and 163A
