THE PRICE OF MEAT

Sir

As a constant reader of your paper, and knowing that the prices of meat are lowering in other towns, I am at a loss to conceive why the Devizes butchers cannot lower the prices of their meat. I send you the prices of meat, copied from a Salisbury paper, in that city:- Prime quality oxen, from 15s. to 15s 6d. per score, which is 9d. and $9\frac{1}{4}$ d. per Ib.; ditto, secondary quality, 12s. 6d. per score, or $7\frac{1}{2}$ d per Ib.; ditto, at 13s. 6d. per score, is less than $8\frac{1}{4}$ d. per Ib; best wether mutton from 8d. to $8\frac{1}{2}$ d. per Ib.; ewe ditto, from $6\frac{1}{2}$ d. to $7\frac{1}{2}$ d.; lamb, from 8d. to 9d. per Ib. I should think the Devizes butchers ought to know how to buy.
