Devizes

John Brown Robbed of Watch on the Highway

On Tuesday the 12th inst between the hours of seven and eight in the evening, John Brown, servant to Mr Nicholas Morris of Devizes, was attacked by two footpads, (on the highway leading from Seend to Devizes, as he was returning home from Bristol) who rushed out of the hedge, struck him off his horse, and then robbed him of his watch and fifteen shillings, and after dangerously wounding him in his head, made off towards this city.

Bath Chronicle Thursday 14 February 1765

On Tuesday the 12th of this inst. February, between the Hours of Seven and Eight o'clock in the Evening. **John Brown**, Servant to **Mr Nicholas Norris**, **of Devizes**, was attacked by two Foot Pads, on the Highway leading from Seend to Devizes, as he was returning Home from Bristol, who rushed out of the Hedge, struck him off from his Horse, and then robbed him of his Watch and fifteen shillings, and after dangerously wounding him on his Head, made off towards Bath.

N.B. The Watch was made by **Mr William Sayer, of Devizes**, and the Owner's Name, **John Brown, Devizes**, was engraved on the Inside Case: The No. of the Case 2383. John Brown desires all Watchmakers, Silversmiths, and others, in Case the said Watch should be exposed to Sale, that they would stop the same, and secure the Person or Persons to exposing it to Sale, and give Intelligence thereof to Mr Nicholas Norris, or the said John Brown, who will pay all reasonable Charges.
