

## Inquest on Oliver Cromwell Greenland on 5 February 1891

On Thursday the Coroner, Mr. F. T. Sylvester, held an inquest at the Barge Inn, Bradford-on-Avon on the body of Oliver Cromwell Greenland, draper of Dilton Marsh, Westbury, Wilts which had been found in the canal the previous day. On Tuesday night the deceased was seen in Bradford, looking very unhappy and unable to give a reason why he was so far from home. He left the Barge Inn about half past ten, and next morning his body was found in the water. His umbrella and one shirt cuff were on the bank and his watch and chain were missing.

The jury returned an open verdict of "Found drowned"
