Harry LOVE 16th September, 1898

Accident at Dinton Station

Sarum Fireman badly injured

A shocking accident occurred at Dinton Station on Monday. It appears that a fireman, named Harry Love, of Bemerton, in the employ of the L & SW Railway was engaged on his engine in shunting operations. Whilst the engine was in motion, he moved forward to the front of it for some reason and slipped, falling into the permanent way. The engine and the tender and the horse box attached passed over him. The poor man was at once conveyed back to Salisbury Station, where he was placed on a stretcher & conveyed straight to the Infirmary.

It was found that, amongst other injuries, that he had a fractured spine. Slight hopes are held for his recovery. On inquiry this (Friday) morning at the Infirmary, Mr Love is still progressing as favourably as can be expected.
