LATE MRS H. E. LAKE

With regret the village heard of the death on August 4th of Mrs Hilda Emmeline Lake, wife of Mr T. Lake, of Fair View.

As Miss Hillier she commenced duty as a pupil teacher in 1907, for two years under her aunt. Miss R. Hunt at St. Thomas's, Salisbury and was later trained at Salisbury College. In 1914 she was appointed certified assistant mistress at Tisbury School. In 1920 she was appointed head mistress at Dinton School, where she taught continually until the day of her death. She was married at Dinton Church on December 29th, 1923. Mrs Lake was on various Committees connected with village welfare and was hon. secretary of Dinton and Baverstock Flower Show,

The funeral took place at St. Mary's Church on Saturday. The chief mourners were: —Mr T. Lake (husband), Gordon and Oswald (sons), Mr S. Hillier (brother), Misses H. S., A. and M. Lake (sisters-in-law). About 100 persons paid their last respect by attending the funeral, among them many of her former and present pupils. Over sixty floral tributes covered the grave.
