SHIPS REPORT

The *Trafalgar* arrived from Plymouth on the 28th of June having been at sea 114 days. She has brought 305 souls to the colony; seven births and four deaths took place during the voyage. It gives me great pleasure to state that this vessel also has arrived in very good order, and though the date of final disembarkation has not yet arrived, everything has till now gone on harmoniously.

MARK YEATS/ YEATES/YATES

Mark Yeats was born at Teffont, Wiltshire around 1823.

Mark Yeats married Mary Ann Burdon at the Church of St. Edith, Baverstock in 1845. Their marriage was registered in the December quarter of 1845, in the registration district of Wilton, Wiltshire. Mary Ann Burdon/ Burden had been born around 1810 in Dorset (possibly Shaftesbury).

A birth was registered in the December quarter of 1846 for Huldah Yeates in the district of Tisbury, Wiltshire.

A birth was registered in the September quarter 1849 for Rosina Yeates in the district of Wilton, Wiltshire. She had been born on 18th July, 1849 at Fovant, Wiltshire. Rosina Yeats was baptised on 19th August, 1849 at Fovant, Wiltshire.

The 1851 Census recorded Mark Yeats (Agricultural Labourer, aged 28, born Teffont, Wilts) living with his wife – Mary Ann (aged 41) & children – Huldah (aged 4, born Teffont, Wilts) & Rosina (aged 1, born Fovant, Wilts) at Dinton, Wiltshire.

A birth was registered in the March quarter 1852, in the district of Wilton, Wiltshire for Selina Yates.

The Yeats/Yates family consisting of parents – Mark & Mary Ann & their children – George (aged 13, born Fovant, Wiltshire in 1841), Huldah (aged 7), Rosina (aged 4) & Selina (aged 1) arrived at Port Adelaide, South Australia on 28th June, 1854.

Hulda Yeates (father's name - Mark Yeates) married Donald Macinnes (father's name - Lachlan Macinnes) on 15th August, 1865 at Poonindie, South Australia. Their marriage was registered in Flinders, South Australia.

Marriage Notice –

McINNES - YEATES – On the 15th August, at Poonindie, Mr Donald McInnes, eldest son of Mr Lachlan McInnes, of the Western Plains, near Port Augusta, to Hulda, eldest daughter of Mr Mark Yeates, of Noarlunga.

Rosina Yates (father's name - Mark Yates) married William Sparrow (father's name - Joseph Sparrow) on 7th May, 1872 at Noarlunga. Their marriage was registered at Willunga, Sth Australia.

Mary Ann Bowden Yates died on 11th January, 1874 at Noarlunga Centre, South Australia, She was aged 63. Her death was registered at Morphett Vale, South Australia & her residence was listed as Near Noarlunga.

Selina Yates (father's name - Mark Yates) married William Laurence Rayner (father's name - John Rayner) on 1st October, 1874 at Noarlunga Centre. Their marriage was registered at Willunga, Sth Australia.

Marriage Notice –

RAYNER - YATES – On the 1st October, at Noarlunga Church, by the Rev. E. K. Miller, William Rayner, of Hackham, to Selina, youngest daughter of Mr Mark Yates, of Noarlunga.

Mark Yates died on 29th May, 1904 at Fullarton. He was aged 82 & his death was registered in Adelaide, South Australia, and his residence was listed as Adelaide. Mark Yates was buried in West Terrace Cemetery – Section Road 1 South.

Rosina Sparrow died on 9th August, 1928 at South Plympton, South Australia.

SPARROW – On the 9th August, at her daughter's residence (Mrs J. Headon), Rosina Sparrow, relict of William Sparrow, late of Reynella and Hackham, in her seventy-ninth year.
