Rudgely	Andrew	For stealing nails, &c., at Dinton. <i>*Outcome – 6 weeks imprisonment</i>	<i>Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette</i> 11 th July, 1850
Whitlock	George	Of Dinton, for having eight pheasant's eggs in his possession at Clarendon. <i>*Outcome – 1 month imprisonment</i>	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 31 st May, 1851
Crowther	Henry	Of Dinton, for poaching. <i>*Outcome – 7 days imprisonment</i>	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 15 th May, 1852
Rudge	Andrew	Of Dinton, for leaving his service. <i>*Outcome – 1 month imprisonment</i>	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 23 rd July, 1853

Brewer	Francis	A pointsman at Dinton Station, pleaded guilty of neglect of duty at Dinton Station – where 2 first class carriages were damaged. <i>*Outcome – 2 months imprisonment- hard labour</i>	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 5 th November, 1859
Singleton	James	Plead guilty to obtaining, by false pretences six quarts of beer, the property of George Jukes, of Dinton. <i>*Outcome – 1 months imprisonment- hard labour</i>	<i>Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette</i> 6 th January, 1870
Haynes	Samuel	Of Dinton, charged with stealing a duck and a chicken, value 3s., the property of Mr David Darling, of Marshwood Farm, Dinton. <i>* Outcome – 1 months imprisonment- hard labour</i>	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 15 th July, 1871
Nash	Jacob	An ex-policeman, was indicted for breaking into the dwelling-house of John Godwin, and stealing a shirt, at Dinton on the 6 th November, 1870. Jury found defendant guilty. <i>* Outcome – 12 months imprisonment- hard labour</i>	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 6 th January, 1872
