Our obituary contains a notice of the death on the 11th inst. of Mr Walter Bailey, of this place, aged 76 years. Mr Bailey was 50 years churchwarden and 35 years guardian of this parish. Five years ago he was presented with a handsome testimonial of respect by 162 fellow parishioners and friends - many of the poor inhabitants voluntarily contributing their pence toward it – as a mark of their esteem and approbation of his conduct as neighbor and friend, and to testify their appreciation of his long services. Mr Bailey was for 20 years assessor of the parish.
