Listed below is a short biography of those brave souls who gave their lives for their country during WWII and are in some way connected to Donhead St. Andrew

ELSE, GEORGE ARNOLD - Signaller 2389385 - VIII Corps Signals, Royal Corps of Signals - Died 15th August 1943 - Age 20 - Son of Norman and Ruth Else of Donhead St. Andrew - Buried at Wivelsfield (SS. Peter and John The Baptist) Churchyard, Wivelsfield, Sussex - Grave/Memorial Reference:- S.E. Sec. Grave 588.

LAMPARD, WILLIAM FRANK - Private 5569887 - 1st Battalion Wiltshire Regiment - Died 22nd February 1944 - Age 23 - Son of Mr. and Mrs. H. Lampard of Donhead St. Andrew - Buried at Maynamati War Cemetery, Bangladesh - Grave/Memorial Reference:- 1. D. 5.

LILLIE, NORMAN - Lance Sergeant 4691243 - A.A.C. 8th Battalion, The Parachute Regiment - Died 24th March 1945 - Age 23 - Son of Sarah Ann Lillie, of Donhead St. Andrew - Buried at Reichswald Forest War Cemetery, Nordrhein-Westfalen, Germany - Grave/Memorial Reference:- 37.C.7.

SPENCER, JAMES BATEMAN - Leading Seaman D/JX 285425 - Royal Navy aboard H. M. S Orchis the vessel was abandoned and beached after her part in the Normandy Landings having received substantial irreparable damage - Died 21st August 1944 - Age 24 - Son of Arthur and Lillian Spencer; Husband of Mary Spencer of Donhead St. Andrew, Wiltshire - Commemorated on the Plymouth Naval Memorial, Plymouth Hoe, Plymouth, Devon - Grave/Memorial Reference:- Panel 85, Column 3.
