Durrington – In this parish, we are pleased to learn, that through the exertions of the Rev. R. Webb and T. E. Fowle, Esq., the sums of 13 £. 7s. 6d. for the Patriotic Fund, and 22 £. 8s. 9d. for the Crimean Army Fund have been collected.

Durrington – Wednesday was observed in this parish, in accordance with the Bishop's pastoral letter, as a day of humiliation and prayer. The services of the church, at 10 a.m. and 7 p.m., were well attended. The Incumbent preached in the morning on Matt. V. 7, "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy;" and in the evening on Psalm cxix. 120, "My flesh trembleth for fear of thee; and I am afraid of thy judgements." Collections amounting to five guineas were made for the Salisbury Infirmary.
