The following were sent to gaol but no particular gaol was specified in the newspaper report.

Surname	Given Names	Crime	Newspaper report
Wilson	John	Charged with stealing a handkerchief & other articles from the cart of Smith, the Durrington carrier. Guilty: 2 calendar months hard labour.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 17 th March, 1849
Birch	Robert	Charged with stabbing Mary Ann Johnson at Durrington on 5 th July. Guilty of assault. Imprisoned for 12 calendar months with hard labour.	<i>Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette</i> 18 th July, 1850
Cooper	John	For leaving the service of Mr Charles Kellow, of Durrington. 10 days imprisonment.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 4 th August, 1860
Hiscock	George	A Labourer, was charged with having stolen a hoe and bottle belonging to a fellow-workman named George Dean. Defendant pleaded guilty. 1 month imprisonment.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 27 th June, 1868
Kinsman	Henry	A rag and bone gatherer, charged with cutting off the tails and manes of horses at Bulford & Durrington. Defendant pleaded guilty. 4 months imprisonment.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 11 th February, 1871
Sheppard	Thomas	Summoned for being drunk & riotous in the street, at Durrington. Defendant had been twice convicted of a similar offence. 7 day's imprisonment with hard labour.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 23 rd March, 1872
