Rivers	Thomas	Carrier, of Durrington, charged with stealing 25 faggots, the property of Richard Crouch, from a copse at Collingbourne Ducis.  Fined 1l. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  1 <sup>st</sup> September, 1860
Long	James	Of Durrington, charged with using a wire for the purpose of taking game, on land belonging to C. E. Rendall, Esq., at Milstone.  Defendant did not appear but was fined 5l. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  16 <sup>th</sup> February, 1861
Maton	John	Summoned for refusing to contribute towards the support of his mother, who had become chargeable to the parish of Durrington.  Ordered to pay 1s. 6d. a week	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  27 <sup>th</sup> July, 1861

Targett	James Johnson	Of Durrington, summoned for driving seven cows more than 500 yards along the highroad, without a license to do so.  Fine of 1l. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  25 <sup>th</sup> August, 1866
Smith	Charles	A butcher, of Durrington, summoned by Police for removing sheep skins, without having the same "effectually covered" as required by the orders of the Privy Council.  Fined 5l. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  15 <sup>th</sup> September, 1866
Toomer	William Herbert	Beerseller at Durrington, charged with selling beer at half-past ten o'clock on Saturday night.  Fined 40s. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  22 <sup>nd</sup> August, 1868
Sheppard	Thomas	Labourer, of Durrington, for being drunk & disorderly at Durrington on the 3 <sup>rd</sup> inst.  Fined 20s. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  13 <sup>th</sup> February, 1869
Batchelor	William	Along with Arthur Gopsill & Samuel Leaney, all three were summoned upon a charge of having been drunk & disorderly at Durrington.  Plead Guilty & fined 5s. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  26 <sup>th</sup> March, 1870
Gopsill	Arthur	Along with William Batchelor & Samuel Leaney, all three were summoned upon a charge of having been drunk & disorderly at Durrington.  Did not appear at hearing. Ordered to pay 10s. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  26 <sup>th</sup> March, 1870
Leaney	Samuel	Along with William Batchelor & Arthur Gopsill, all three were summoned upon a charge of having been drunk & disorderly at Durrington. Mr E. F. Kelsey appeared on behalf of Leaney & was instructed to plead guilty & express regret for his misconduct.  Ordered to pay 10s. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  26 <sup>th</sup> March, 1870
Chamberlain	Stephen	Summoned on a complaint for encroaching on a highway at Durrington, by depositing rubbish thereon.  Fined 20s. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  3 <sup>rd</sup> September, 1870
Spreadbury	Walter	For being drunk at Durrington on 28 <sup>th</sup> January.  Fined 5s. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  10 <sup>th</sup> February, 1872
Ranger	Frederick	For being drunk and guilty of riotous behavior at Durrington on 28 <sup>th</sup> January.  Fined 5s. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  10 <sup>th</sup> February, 1872

Shepherd	Thomas	A Labourer, of Durrington, charged with drunken & disorderly conduct in the streets of Durrington on 3 <sup>rd</sup> February. Defendant had previously been fined for a similar offence three years ago.  Ordered to pay same fine – 20s. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  24 <sup>th</sup> February, 1872
Toomer	William Herbert	Beer-house keeper, of Durrington, charged with permitting drunkenness in his house.  Fined 40s. and costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  16 <sup>th</sup> March, 1872
Horsell	Henry	Of Durrington, was charged, on the complaint of Superintendent Wolfe, with having a weighing machine which was not correct.  Fine was restricted to 1l. And costs.	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i>  30 <sup>th</sup> November, 1872
