CUTTING OFF TAILS AND MANES OF HORSES

At the office of the Clerk to the County Magistrates, in this city, on Wednesday, a man named Henry Kinsman, rag and bone gatherer, was brought before Mr E. Hinxman, Mr H. J. F. Swayne, and Mr G. M. Fort, charged with cutting off the tails and manes of two horses, and the tails off five other horses, the property of Mr John Robbins, farmer, Bulford, and also with cutting off the tails and manes of four horses, the property of Mr Charles Kellow, Durrington, doing damage to the amount of 17s. He pleaded guilty, and was committed to prison for four months.
