

## Kelly's Directory Extract 1867 Durrington



**Durrington** is a village on the river Avon, in the Southern division of the county, Amesbury hundred and union, Salisbury county court district, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury, and rural deanery of Amesbury, 2 miles northwest from Amesbury, and 10 north-west from Salisbury.

The church of All Saints consists of nave, chancel, and north and south aisles; the south aisle is Norman; the church was rebuilt in 1851, with the exception of the tower, which is Perpendicular; the remainder is in the Early English style; a Norman arcade has been retained: there are four beautiful memorial windows (by Messrs. Michael and Arthur O'Connor) to the memory of the late incumbent, the Rev R. Webb, M.A. The register dates from 1591. The living is a perpetual curacy, value £127, in the gift of the Dean and Chapter of Winchester, and held by the Rev. Charles S. Ruddle T.A., of King's College, London.

There is a National school, partly supported by voluntary contributions; and a chapel for Independents.

The manor is held by the Warden and Fellows of Winchester College, and the East End manor is held by the trustees of Sir E. Poore, Bart., and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners. The principal landowners are Thomas E. Fowle, esq., and George Pearce Moore, esq.

The chief crops are wheat, barley and oats.

In 1861 the population was 440; the acreage 2,682.

On the Downs are many barrows, among which is Knighton Long Barrow. To the south is the great British station called Durrington Walls.

Knighton is half a mile north-west.
