

Kellys Directory Extract 1915 Durrington



DURRINGTON is a parish and village on the river Avon, 1 mile north-west from Bulford station and 2 miles north from Amesbury station, on the London & South Western railway, and 10 north from Salisbury in the Southern division of the county, Amesbury hundred and union, petty sessional division of Salisbury & Amesbury, Salisbury county court district, rural deanery of Amesbury, (Amesbury portion), archdeaconry of Sarum, and diocese of Salisbury. The church of All Saints is a building of flint and stone, consisting of chancel, nave of three bays, aisles and western tower, with pinnacles, containing a clock and 5 bells: the south aisle is Norman. The church was rebuilt in 1851, with the exception of the tower, which is Perpendicular; the remainder is in the Early English style: a Norman arcade has been retained; there are 4 memorial windows to the Rev R Webb MA, a former rector, and 3 others are also stained: in the chancel is a canopied double piscina with credence over, and in the south aisle a piscine: the pulpit, choir stalls and many benches are of ancient carved oak; there are 300 sittings. The register dates from 1591. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value about £200, in the gift of the Dean & Chapter of Winchester, and held since 1910 by the Rev Auriol Giffard Ruddle, Theol Assoc of Kings College, London. Here is a Congregational chapel seating 150. Allen's charity of 20s yearly is derived from a rent-charge left in 1714 by Thomas Allen of this parish: Alt's charity, nominally of 12s yearly, is distributed to the oldest poor communicants at the church. On the downs are many barrows, among which is Knighton Long Barrow. To the south is the great British station called Durrington Walls. The manor is held by the Warden and Fellows of Winchester College and the East End manor by Admiral Sir Richard Poore bart KCB, CVO. The principal landowners are Admiral Sir Richard Poore bart KCB, CVO, Harry Powney esq, H M War Office, and Winchester College. The soil is light and chalky, sub-soil chalk; the chief crops are wheat, barley, oats, potatoes, hay and pasture: the area is 2692 acres of land, and 10 of water: rateable value £4106: population in 1911, 897.
