First Royal Flying Corps aviation deaths remembered



Soldiers based in Wiltshire commemorated 100 years since the first aviation deaths in the history of the Royal Flying Corps.

About 200 soldiers from the Wessex Gunners, Larkhill's 32 Regiment Royal Artillery, marched to a commemoration service at the Garrison Church of St Alban with St Barbra.

Capt. Eustace Lorain and Staff Sgt R. H. V. Wilson were killed on 5 July 1912 when their aircraft crashed near Stonehenge.
