

**EASTERTON** is an ecclesiastical parish 2 miles from Lavington station and 7 miles south of Devizes station, on the Newbury and Bath section of the Great Western railway, formed in 1875 from the parish of Market Lavington, consisting of the tithings of Easterton, Eastcott and Fiddington, in the Eastern division of the county, Swanborough hundred, Devizes petty sessional division, union and county court district, rural deanery of Potterne, (Potterne portion), archdeaconry of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury. The church of St Barnabas, erected in 1875, is a building of red brick, in the Early English style, consisting of nave, chancel, south porch, and a western turret containing one bell: there are about 150 sittings. The register dates from the year 1875. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £250, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury, and held since 1895 by the Rev Gilbert Alfred King MA of Merton College, Oxford. Here is a Weslyan chapel. The principal landowners are the Crown, J W Morgan Williams esq, and the Rev Charles F W T Williams. The soil is loam, sub-soil, green sand; the chief crops are corn and roots. The area is 1653 acres, rateable value £2027. The population in 1911 was 323 in the civil and 511 in the ecclesiastical parish.

Wall Letter Box, Eastcott: cleared at 9.15am & 7.45pm. Sundays, 7.45pm.
