Butcher	William	<p style="text-align: center;">Sacred</p> <p style="text-align: center;">To the Memory of Mr. William Butcher who was born at Rushall in this County on the 18th day of January 1776 and departed this Life at Pamphill House on the 22nd day of February 1818 in the 43rd year of his age (he was the third son of Mr. John Butcher late of this Parish) to which place by his particular desire, his remains were brought for interment also of Jane</p> <p>Wife of the above named Mr. William Butcher and only daughter of William Vale Esq. Of Portman Street, Portmna Square, London. Who immediately after the decease of her husband incapable of sustaining her great loss, rapidly sunk into a deep decline and departed this life at Weymouth in Dorsetshire (where she had retired for change of air) on the 18th day of January 1819, in the 43rd year of her age Surviving her husband only 11 months Her elder Brother Mr. John Vale of May Fair, London; caused this Tablet to be Erected to their Memory</p>
Francis	William	<p>(Benefaction Board)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">William Francis. Merchant and Citizen of London, and a Native of thgis Place: by his Last Will dated May1st 1605 bequeathed the Sum of L500 to this Parish for ever in manner following; viz.</p> <p>I give to the Minister and Churchwardens of the Parish of Easton, in Wilts: for the time being, Five Hundred Pounds upon Trust, to ivest the same in Governement Securities and to apply and distribute the Dividends, Interest, and annual Proceeds thereof to and amongst the industrious Poor of the said Parish for the time being Yearly on Christmas Day, for ever, in such way and manner, as the Minister and Churchwardens for the Time being or the major Part of them shall deem most conductive to the comfort of such Poor.</p>

Lawes	James	<p>To the Memory of the Revd. James Townsend Lawes A.M. Late Master of the Free Grammar School, Marlborough Succesively Rector of Abinger, Surrey and Vicar of Halberton, Devonshire also 14 Years Minister of the Parish Died October 13th 1828 Aged 49 Sarah Lawes His Widow Died at Marlborough 30th June 1867 Aged 84</p>
LLlewellyn	David	<p>To the Memory of The Revd. Davis Llewellyn 29 years Incumbent of the Parish who Died September 24th 1868 Aged 75 years also of Elizabeth His Widow who fell asleep June 15th 1880</p>
LLlewellyn	David Herbert	<p>The East window and this tablet are dedicated to the Memory of David Herbert Llewellyn youngest son of the Revd. David Llewellyn Minister of this Parish He was Surgeon of the Confederate War-Steamer "Alabama" and after her engagement with the Federal Stramer "Kearsage", off Cherbourg, nobley refusing to imperi, the escape of the wounded, he sank with his ship on the 19 th of June 1864, in the 26 th year of his age. Erected by voluntary contribution in admiration of his self sacrificing courage</p>
