1814

Death At Salisbury, Mrs. Sarah Coatswith. She was found drowned in the river behind Fisherton mills. New Monthly Magazine, 1814, January to June, Volume 1, 1 May 1814

1815

A few days since died, at Reading, aged 16, Eliza Maria, the youngest daughter of J.H. Greene, Esq, lately a resident in Fisherton, near this city.

1818

On Sunday the 8th inst. died, at her house in Fisherton, aged 71, Mrs. Surman, relict of the late Mr. Robert Surman, builder, of Fisherton. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 16 February 1818

1827

Monday last died of inflammation of the lungs, aged eleven months, Anna, daughter of Mr. Coles, of Fisherton, near this city. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 12 March 1827**

Wednesday died, after a short illness, Mr. Thomas Collins, of the Angel Inn, Fisherton Anger, aged 37. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 25 June 1827

On Tuesday last died, in the 32nd year of his age, Mr. Frederick Ball, baker, of Fisherton Anger. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 25 June 1827

1830

On Wednesday died, in her 22nd year, Emma, eldest daughter of Mr. W. Smith, of Fisherton Anger. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 29 April 1830
