Fittleton



Fittleton is a parish and village in the Southern division of the county, hundred of Elstub and Everleigh, Pewsey union, Devizes county court district, diocese of Salisbury, archdeaconry of Wilts, and rural deanery of Potterne, 13 miles north from Salisbury, 13 south-east from Devizes, and 14 west from Andover.

The church of All Saints consists of a small chancel, nave and aisles, with a tower, spire and 5 bells. It contains several monuments to the Beach family. The register dates from 1623. The living is a rectory, of the yearly value of £500, with residence, in the gift of Magdalen College, Oxford, and held by the Rev. Thomas Pearse, B.D., of that College.

There is a small endowed school on the National system. Charities of £5 13s 4d yearly are distributed.

Rt. Hon. Sir M E Hicks Beach, bart., M.P., is lord of the manor and principal landowner.

The soil is light and chalky; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley and oats.

The area is 3,179 acres; gross estimated rental, £2,550; rateable value, £2,254; and the population in 1871 was 394.

Haxton (or Hackleston) is a tithing.
