

Apprentíces Great Wishford

A Wishford Charity, bequeathed by Daniell Oland, in 1735, to be administed by the minister and churchwardens, made provision for the payment of a premium to master tradesmen outside the parish, to apprentice the poor boys of the parish. The following advertisements appeared in local newspapers.

BOYS wanting Situations as APPRENTICES.

A **NUMBER OF BOYS**, about the age of 14, are ready to be **APPRENTICED OUT**, from the Free School at **WISHFORD**, in the county of Wilts, to Carpenters, Shoemakers, and other trades.

An early application is requested to the Minister or Churchwardens of the Parish; if by letter post-paid.

A premium of Ten Pounds will be given with each.

BOYS wanting Situations as **APPRENTICES**.

A number of **BOYS**, about the age of 14, are ready to be **APPRENTICED** out of the **FREE SCHOOL at WISHFORD**, in the county of Wilts, to Mechanical Trades. Each Master wishing to take such Apprentice is required to produce or send (free of postage) a certificate, signed by the Minister, church-wardens, and Overseers of the Poor of the parish where he resides, stating that he is of the Established Church, and a proper person to take an Apprentice; such certificate to be sent to the Minister and Church wardens of the parish of Wishford aforesaid.

A premium of £20 will be given.
