Slate Club Supper 1907

The annual supper of the Wishford Slate Club was held at the "Royal Oak" on Thursday evening, when the chairman (Mr. T. G. Mundy) presided. After the loyal toast, Mr. V. Hewett submitted "The Imperial Forces," to which Sergt. W. Mundy responded. "The Club" was proposed by Mr. Andrews, the secretary (Mr. T. Dobell) acknowledging the toast.

He said the year began with a balance in hand of £12 6s. 4d., including which, the receipts amounted to £110 10s. 4d., the payments, including 345 1s. divided among the members, amounted to £99 14s 9d., leaving a balance in hand of £10 15s. 7d. There were 122 members good on the books.

The visitors were toasted on the proposition of Mr. G. M. Young, Mr. E. H. R. Brown responding. Mr. Pike gave "The Chairman," and Mr. Whatley, "The Host and Hostess." In addition to those mentioned Mr. Morrice was also present.
