

Kellys Directory Extract 1915 Hankerton



Hankerton is a village and parish 4 miles west from Minety station on the Swindon and Gloucester section and 4 northeast from Malmesbury terminal station on a branch of the Great Western railway. It is in the North Western division of the county, Malmesbury union, hundred, petty sessional division and county court district, and in the rural deanery of Malmesbury, archdeaconry of North Wilts and diocese of Bristol.

The church of the Holy Cross is an ancient fabric of stone, in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, added in 1906, nave, south porch and a fine and lofty western tower containing 4 bells. There are sittings for 100 persons. The register dates from the year 1699. The living is a vicarage, net income £135, with residence and 10 acres of glebe, in the gift of Mrs Adkin, and held by the Rev Gilbert Lee Hankey, M.A. of Selwyn College, Cambridge.

The charities amount to £12 yearly.

The Earl of Suffolk and Berkshire, who is lord of the manor, J R Randolph, esq., M.A., K.C., and A J L Murray-Shirreff, esq., are the principal landowners.

The soil is sandy and loamy; subsoil, clay and flints. The parish consists chiefly of pasture lands.

The area is 2,203 acres; rateable value, £2,232; population in 1911, 240

Cloatley is a tithing half a mile east. Bishoper 2 miles west
