Hankerton



Hankerton is a village and parish, 4 miles west from Minety station on the Swindon and Gloucester section and 4 north-east from Malmesbury terminal station on a branch of the Great Western railway, in the Chippenham division of the county, rural district, hundred, petty sessional division, county court district and rural deanery of Malmesbury, archdeaconry of Swindon and diocese of Bristol.

The church of the Holy Cross is an ancient fabric of stone in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, added in 1906, nave, south porch and a fine lofty western tower containing 4 bells. There are sittings for 190 persons. The register dates from the year 1699. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £262, with residence and 9¼ acres of glebe, in the gift of the Bishop of Bristol, and held since 1926 by the Rev Edgar Packer, M.A., of Oxford University.

The charities amount to £12 yearly.

The Earl of Suffolk and Berkshire is lord of the manor and the principal landowner.

The soil is sandy and loamy; subsoil, clay and flints.

The parish consists chiefly of pasture lands. The area is 2,203 acres; the population in 1921 was 243.

Cloatley is a tithing half a mile east. Bishoper, 2 miles west.
