Rev John H Wise, B.A. Curate

Hankerton is a small scattered village 4 miles west from Minety station and north-east from Malmesbury, in the Hundred of the same.

The living is a vicarage, in the patronage and incumbency of the Rev William Maskelyne, M.A., value £300 per annum, including the glebe. The Rev John H Wise, B.A., is the curate. The church is an ancient and large fabric, in the early English style of architecture, consisting of a fined lofty tower, 4 bells, a nave, and chancel.

Here is a Free school, and it is in contemplation to erect a new school-room.

The population, in 1841, was 417; the area in acres, 2,127; rateable value, £2,895.

The Earl of Suffolk is lord of the manor.
