The Rev. T.H. Bland, curate of the combined parishes of Durweston and Bryanston, has been appointed to the Rectory of St. Andrew, Heddington, near Calne. Mr. Bland has done good work during the four years of his residence in Durweston, especially among the men of the parish, a large number of whom are members of the Bible Class. He is a decided Evangelical and a good preacher. He was ordained in 1897, and was for five years curate of Fisherton Anger. **Western Gazette, 12 October 1906**
