Unsolicited Generosity

The Earl of Radnor with his usual generosity and kind consideration for the poor has unsolicited presented £20 to be given in clothing to the poor of this town. The yearly income of the public charities of this town amounts to upwards of £200; by this sum more than 900 persons at Christmas are annually supplied with bread and beef of the first quality. In addition, 20 men and women are completely clothed and various sums at from 2s. 6d. to 5s. are given to at least 50 deserving poor and every two years, gifts of £7 each are made to young tradesmen. The administration of these charities does honour to the Trustees.
