This is the last Will and Testament of me John Coleman of Highworth in the County of Wilts Gentleman which I hereby make publish and declare in manner following (that is to say) ffirst I give and bequeath unto my Niece Ann Hopkins (the Wife of John Hopkins of London Gentleman) the sum of fifty Pounds of lawful Money of Great Britain Also I give and

bequeath unto my Nephew Walter Brind the Elder of London Goldsmith the sum of thirty Pounds of like Money Also I give and bequeath unto my Nephew Thomas Brind of London Silver Turner the sum of thirty Pounds of like Money Also I give and bequeath unto my Nieces Alice Saunders (the Wife of James Saunders of Highworth aforesaid Cheese ffactor) and Ann Thompson (the Wife of William Thompson of Cirencester in the County of Gloucester Gentleman) and my Nephew Henry Kinneir the Younger of Highworth aforesaid Surgeon the sum of twenty pounds a piece of like Money Also I give and bequeath to Henry Kinneir the Elder of Highworth aforesaid Surgeon the sum of five pounds of like Money to buy himself Mourning with all which said several and respective Legacies I will and direct my Executor hereinafter named to Pay my respective and several Legatees within twelve Months next after my decease Also I give and bequeath unto my Brother Henry Coleman of Highworth aforesaid Mercer his Executors Administrators and Assigns all the rest and residue of my Household and other Goods Chattels ready Money securities for Money Debts Personal Estate and Effects whatsoever and wheresoever which I have not herein before disposed of subject nevertheless to and I hereby charge the same and every part thereof with and for the Payment of my Debts ffuneral and Testamentary Expences and Legacies respectively And Lastly I hereby revoke and make void all former and other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made and declare this only to be my last Will and Testament And I hereby make constitute and appoint my said Brother Henry Coleman sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I the said John Coleman the Testator have hereunto set my Hand and Seal the nineteenth day of August in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty one *John Coleman*
