

Post Office Directory Extract 1875

Hillmarton



Hillmarton is a parish in the Northern division of the county, hundred of Kingsbridge, Calne union and county court district, partly in Cricklade parliamentary borough, diocese of Salisbury, archdeaconry of Wilts and rural deanery of Avebury, 3 miles north-north-east from Calne, 7 south-west from Wootton Bassett and 90 from London.

The church of St Lawrence is a handsome structure. It has chancel, nave, north aisle, porch, and a square embattled tower surmounted by four pinnacles. In 1840 the tower was partly rebuilt. The windows of the nave are all of the Perpendicular period, probably about Henry VII's time. The nave is separated from the aisles by columns of the Early English order, and the chancel is entered from the aisle through an opening of unusual character in the buttress of the chancel arch. The chancel windows are all of modern Perpendicular work, the whole having been renewed when the church was restored. The building is extremely well kept and the chancel windows are of stained glass.

In the aisle, towards the east end, is a founder's tomb, without any recumbent figure, and near it a memorial window of three lights to the late vicar, the Rev. Francis Fisher, the subject the "Good Shepherd". The chief monuments in the church are those of Calley, Quinten and Thomas Poynder, esq., who restored the church. The seating is chiefly of the old oak, of handsome carved pattern, and well restored. The greatest curiosity of the church is the old chained Bible, with wooden binding, well restored by the late vicar, who found it in the parish chest in a neglected state with the original chain still attached, and replaced it at the chancel arch.

The tower contains a fine peal of five bells, most of them of ancient date. The register dates from 1645. The living is a vicarage, of the yearly value of £400, in the patronage of the Crown, and held by the Rev. Francis Goddard, M.A., of Brasenose College, Oxford, rural dean and surrogate and J.P.

Thomas Poynder, esq., built a school here for poor children. The Independents have a chapel at **Goatacre** tithing, a mile and a half north, in this parish, and the Baptists have a chapel at Hillmarton. Jacob's charity of £10 yearly is for the second poor.

William Henry Poynder, esq., is lord of the manor. The principal landowners are William Henry Poynder, esq., Worcester College and Magdalen College, Oxford, John Large, esq., and William Abbott Large, esq.

The soil is Oxford clay, oolite, except Cleevancy district which is on the chalk. The chief crops are wheat, beans and oats.

The area is 4,182 acres; rateable value, £7,821 17s 8d; the parish contained 797 inhabitants in 1871.

Beversbrook is a tithing and Cleevancy is a hamlet.
