

## Post Office Directory Extract 1875 **Hilperton**



**Hilperton** is a parish and pleasant village in the Northern division of the county, hundred and union of Melksham, county court district of Trowbridge, diocese of Salisbury, archdeaconry of Wilts and rural deanery of Potterne, a mile and a half north-east from Trowbridge station, 98 miles from London, 4 south-west from Melksham and 3 south-east from Bradford.

The church of St Michael is a plain stone building, with square tower, surmounted by a low spire and containing 4 bells and clock. The nave and chancel were rebuilt about 1854, in the Middle Pointed style. The registers date from the year 1691. The living is a rectory, with that of Whaddon annexed, of the joint yearly value of £500, with residence, in the gift of the trustees of the late R P Long, esq., and held by the Rev. Thomas Henry Tait, M.A|., of Trinity College, Cambridge.

Here is a National school for boys and girls, which was enlarged in 1875. The Baptists and Wesleyans have each a chapel here.

The soil is clay; subsoil, gravel, shallow rock and clay. The land is chiefly in pasture.

The land belongs principally to the trustees of R P Long, esq., who are lords of the manor.

The parish has an area of 1,078 acres; gross estimated rental, £3,647; rateable value, £3,060; the population in 1871 was 917.
