Accident to Carter

On Friday morning, a carter in the employ of Mr. Pratt, of Hindon, was leaving the corn stores of Messrs. Scott and Smith, Warminster, with a wagon laden with corn, when he was knocked down by the sudden starting of one of the horses and a wheel of the wagon went over his left leg and broke it. One of the horses also trod on the calf of his right leg, and severely wounded it; he also received a bruise on the chin. We understand the man had a very narrow escape of his life. He was taken to the surgery of Mr. Bleeck, where he received prompt attention, and at a late hour was sent home by Messrs. Scott and Smith. It is satisfactory to know that he was quite sober when the accident occurred.
