



## WILTSHIRE HOLT SPA

### Holt Spa Water

The proprietor of this spa, anxious that the lower classes may have the benefit of this famous medicine with as little trouble and expense as possible, and finding that great numbers are deprived of it from the difficulty of obtaining it, has now made an arrangement with the carriers in different directions, and requests that persons for whom it may be prescribed will have jars or small casks for the carrier at the Black Horse, Salisbury; and the Crown, Devizes, where it will be delivered weekly, at 1s. 3d. per gallon, at Salisbury; and 1s. per gallon at Devizes; to be paid for on delivery, in quantities not less than two gallons.

Sold in bottles and orders taken in by Mr. Crutwell, Bath; Mr. Bulgin, Bristol; Mr. Easton, Salisbury, Mr. Long, Trowbridge; Mr. Hopkins, Bradford; Mr. Coombs, Chippenham; Mr. Mortimer, Marlborough; Mr. Baily, Calne; Mr. Smith and Mrs. Newton, Devizes; Mr. Fuller, Newbury; Messrs. Smart and Cowslade, Reading; at the Waterhouse, No.21 Maiden-lane, London; and by the vendors of medicines in all the principal towns in the kingdom, from 8s. and 6d. to 12s., per dozen, bottles included, according to distance.

Arnot, the proprietor at the Spa – These waters are also sold at No. 21 Maiden-lane, Covent-Garden, and Mrs. Watkins, No.11 Fleet-Street, London.

N.B. This water has been found to be a specific in all scrofula and scorbutic cases for more than a hundred years back. – Holt Spa, near Melksham, May 29th, 1804
