# 1809

Salisbury On Saturday night, on the 18th inst. As Mr Godwin, butcher, Homington, was returning home from this city, where he had been keeping market, and had drank rather freely, crossing the bridge, he fell into the river and was drowned. Salisbury and Winchester Journal 27 February 1809

### 1833

Diocese of Salisbury On Tuesday last, as a labouring man, of the name of Jacob Street, of Homington, was returning home from this city, on arriving the bottom of Harnham Hill, he fell down and instantly expired. Salisbury and Winchester Journal 28 October 1833

## 1868

Homington. Accident. On Thursday, a boy named Thomas Harris was attempting to jump a hurdle, when he fell and broke his right leg. He was taken to the Salisbury ... Western Gazette 13 March 1868

Homington. Accident to a child. On Tuesday child named Loder, who is about two years old, and whose parents live in this village, was much burnt owing to his clothes taking fire. His mother was from home at the time and he was left in the cottage with some other little children. He was taken to the Salisbury Infirmary. Salisbury and Winchester Journal 24 October 1868

# 1869

On Friday afternoon a team of horses, with a wagon, were proceeding to Homington Farm, when the animals took fright and one of the men in charge, named Miller, was knocked down and had both legs fractured. He was immediately conveyed to the Salisbury Infirmary. **Western Gazette 5 March 1869** 

Accident at Homington On Thursday, a young man named Street, in the employ of Mr Flower, fell from a cart in which he was riding. He was taken up insensible, and was conveyed to the Salisbury Infirmary where every attention was paid to his case. **Western Gazette 28 May 1869** 

### 1872

Homington. Accident. On Saturday evening, as lad named William Penny, who works for Mr Read, was loading a wagon with barley, he fell and one of the wheels passed over his chest. He was conveyed as soon as possible to the Salisbury Infirmary. Salisbury and Winchester Journal 14 September 1872
