1857

Salisbury, County Petty Sessions - Tuesday Present: J. H. Jacob, Esq. (Chairman), Earl Nelson, T. E. Fowle, Esq., E. Hinxman, Esq., and A. F. Paxton, Esq. Stealing eggs George Haycock was charged with stealing two eggs, and William Young with stealing one egg, the property of Mr John Brown, of Homington. The prisoners both pleaded guilty, and were each sentenced to ten days' hard labour.

1868

County Petty Sessions – Tuesday Henry Powell, who pleaded guilty to a charge of drunkenness and indecent conduct in the parish of Homington, was fined 2s. 6d. and 8s costs.

County Petty Sessions - Tuesday Before Mr. H. J. F. Swayne and Mr. G. M. Fort George Poyle, a labourer, Homington, pleaded guilty to being drunk whilst in charge of two horses, at Coombe Bissett, on Jan. 28th and was fined 5s inclusive
