1892

At the Primitive Methodist Chapel, on New Year's Eve, Mr. Case, of Fisherton gave the children a tea and subsequently a magic lantern exhibition, depicting the lives of David and St. Paul and views of Palestine. **Salisbury Times, Friday, 1 January 1892**

1904

On Sunday the friends celebrated their harvest festival. Sermons were preached morning and evening by Mr. G. Penny and collections were taken. The chapel was tastefully decorated with flowers, fruit and vegetables, given by friends. On Monday a service was conducted by the Rev. G. Litten.
