This Indenture made the four made the Seaven and Twentieth day of June in the yeare of our Lord God One Thousand Seaven Hundred and One , and in the Thirteenth yeare of the Reigne of Our Soveraigne Lord William the third by the grace of God of England Scotland France and Ireland King Defender of the faith yt **Betweene** Alexander Popham of Littlecott in the county of Wiltes Esq. Of the one part, And Thomas Leyson of Ramsbury in the countyaforesaid Gent. Of the other part **Witnesseth** that the said Alexander Popham in consideration of five shillings of lawfull money of England in hand paid by the said Thomas Leyson before the Sealeing and Delivery of this Indenture The Receipt whereof the said Alexander Popham doth hereby acknowledge **Bath** Bargained and Sold and by these preents doth Bargaine and Sell unto the said Thomas Leyson All that parcell of meadow comonly called the Socks Acre conteyning One acre and Two roods be it more or less in Sanden Fee in the Parish of Hungerford in the county of Berks att the Upper end of a certaine comon Meadow there called Brownes Meade and alsoe all those other parcels of Meadow there called the Crookes als Crokes adjoining to each other and in the whole conteyning Three acres and Two Roods be it more or less the Upper parts of which Three acres and two Roods of meadow doe next adjoyne to the said meadow called Socks Acre and to a close of meadow of the said Alexander Popham called Clay Meade, and other parts of the said Three acres and two Roods as alsoe the said Socks and adjoyne on the South East to the Kings Highwaythere leading from Hungerford aforesaid toward Standon Husseyand all and every other parcell and parcells of meadow grounds adjoyning to Clay Meade aforesaid and comonly called or knowne by the name of the Crooks and alsoe all Wayes Waters Watercourses comon of pasture casementsprofitts and Hereditaments belonging to the said severall parcells of meadow hereby conveyed and the Revercon and Revercons Remainder and Remainders of all and singular the same premises $\, \mathcal{ar Co}\,$ have and to hold all and singular the said premises with the appurtences hereby Bargained and sold unto the said Thomas Leyson his Heres Adms. and Assignes from the day next before the day of the date hereof for and dureing the Terme of One whole yeare from thence next on sueing **Peilbing** and Paying therefore unto the said Alexander Popham his Heires and Assignes the Rent of one pepper corne att the Feast of St. Michael the Archangel next comeing If the same be demanded $\it {\it To}$ the *intent* and purpose that by Virtue of these presents and of the Statue for transferring of uses into possession the said Thomas Leyson may be in the actuall possession of the premises and be thereby inabled to accept and so be a Grant and Release of the Revercon and inheritance thereof to him and his Heires To the onely propper use and behoofe of him the said Thomas Leyson his Heires and Assignes for ever In Witness whereof the parties first above named to these presents Indentures interchangeably have sett their hands and seales the day and year first above written.
