



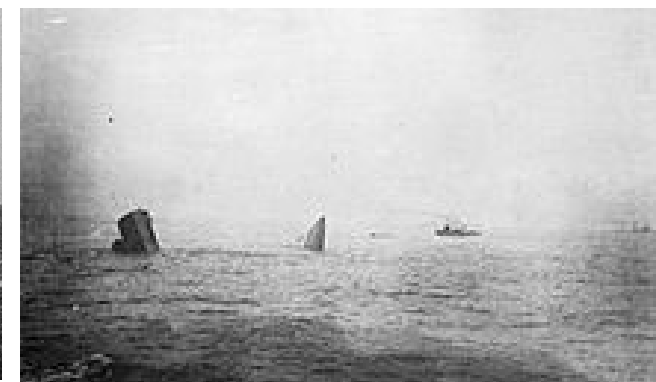
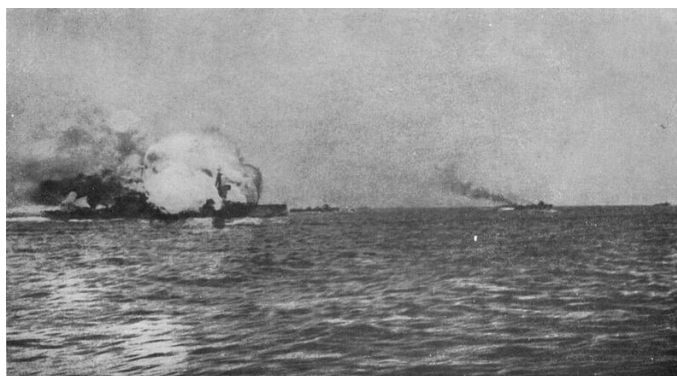
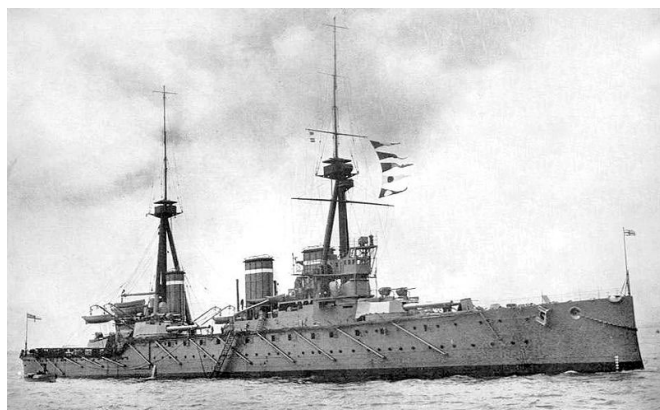

Alfred Henry Pearce had two half-sisters - Alice Mary Dunn Thorn born 1909 and Elsie Dora 1910; There was also a half-brother Godfrey Job Thorne 1914
