Inglesham

A SMALL village 2 miles from Lechlade, 3 from Highworth, and 9 from Cricklade and Swindon, Inglesham is in the Swindon Division of Wilts, Swindon and Highworth Union, Petty Sessional Division and County Court District of Swindon, and Diocese of Bristol. The register of the Church of St. John the Baptist dates from 1598; and the living is a vicarage in the gift of the Bishop of Bristol. Area, 1,238 acres; rateable value, £1,856; population, 120. The school is now closed, and the children are conveyed to Highworth by motor bus. Letters arrive through Lechlade, which is the nearest Money Order and Telegraph Office and Railway Station, and the wall boxes are cleared at 5.20 p.m.
