On Sunday the 3d inst. was married, at Heytesbury, Mr George Barnes to Miss Martha Richardson, both of Knook.

(*Salisbury and Winchester Journal* – Monday 11 November, 1805)

On Sunday the 22^d inst. was married by the Rev. Wm. Poticary, Mr Roger Rebbeck, of Knook, to Ann Alford, youngest daughter of William Alford, of Upton Lovell, in this county.

(*Salisbury and Winchester Journal* – Monday 30 August, 1819)

On Monday the 25th instant, was married at Knook, in this county, by the Rev. D. Williams, Mr Joseph Marks, to Miss Fricker, eldest daughter of the late Mr Thomas Fricker, of Knook.

(*Salisbury and Winchester Journal* – Monday 1 September, 1828)

Married, at Knook, On Thursday last, by the Rev. D. Williams, Mr Robert Raxworthy, of Ashton, to Anne, only daughter of Mr Flower, of Knook both in this county.

(*Salisbury and Winchester Journal* – Monday 9 September, 1833)

Married, on Monday, the 9th inst., at Bath, Mr James Fricker, of Buffalo, United States, North America, to Mary Anne, second daughter of Mr T. Parham. Of Knook-farm, in this county.

(*Salisbury and Winchester Journal* – Monday 16 March, 1835)

Married – At Bath, Mr Henry Perham, of Knook, Wilts, to Frances Troughton, eldest daughter of John Edgar, esq. late of Heytesbury.

(Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette – Thursday 14 September, 1837)

Married, at the parish church, Warminster, by the Rev. W. Dalby, Vicar, Mr James Cornish, of Warminster, to Elizabeth, third daughter of the late Mr W. Axford, of Knook, Wilts.

&

Married – Mr James Cornish of Warminster, to Elizabeth, 3d daughter of the late Mr W. Oxford, of Knook, Wilts.

Married, Dec. 4, at Knook, by the Rev. J. Knight, Frederick, eldest son of R. Reynolds, Esq., clothier, of Knook, to Ann, youngest daughter of the late J. Whale, Esq., of Ashton Gifford.

DEATHS

On Monday the 12th inst. died, at Knook, after a lingering illness, Miss Burt, daughter of the late Mr Burt, of Warminster.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Monday 26 December, 1803)

On Tuesday morning died, of an apoplectic fit, Mr Powell, Of Knook, aged 64.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Monday 3 September, 1804)

On Friday died, much lamented, Mr John Harman, a respectable farmer, of Knook, in this county.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Monday 6 June, 1808)

On Sunday the 17th inst. died, at Knook, in the 20th year of her age, after a short but severe illness, Charlotte Snelgrove, only sister of Mrs Flower, of that place.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Monday 25 July, 1814)

Died, October 30, at Knook, after a short illness, Elizabeth, wife of Mr Obadiah Green, leaving a family and a large circle of friends to lament her loss.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Monday 18 November, 1833)

Died, on Monday, the 5th inst., after a short illness, Mr George Searchfield, of Knook, in this county, leaving a large family to deplore their loss.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Monday 12 May, 1834)

Died – Lately, at Knook, Mary Lewis, aged 81 years, the faithful servant of the late Mrs Jonathan Flower, of Heytesbury Mills, in this county, and the successors of her family, for upwards of 68 years ! being only 13 when she came into Mrs Flower's service, which situation she retained during her long life.

(Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette – Thursday 26 May, 1842)

Died, June 11, at Jefferson, Ashtabula county, Ohio, United States, North America, Mrs Mary Ann Fricker, wife of Mr James Fricker, of that place, aged 35 years. Mr James Fricker is the second son of the late Mr Thos. Fricker, of Knook farm, near Heytesbury, and his wife was the second daughter of Mr Thomas Parham, the present occupier of the above farm.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Saturday 2 August, 1845)

Died, Jan. 7, at his own residence at Lydlinch, aged 28 years, Thomas, fourth son of Mr Thomas Parham, of Knook Farm, Heytesbury, Wilts, and nephew to Mr R. Parham, of the former place.
