I Mary Lockton of Laycock in the County of Wilts Widow do make this my last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say I give and bequeath unto my Niece Betty Coles (Wife of Thomas Coles of Laycock aforesaid Sawyer) and Mary Brown (Wife of James Brown of Lavington in the said County of Wilts Gardener) all my Wearing Apparel both Linen Woollen and every other description equally to be divided between them and to be delivered to them within one week after my Interment And as to all the rest and residue of my Goods Chattels Monies Securities for Money Debts Effects and Personal Estate whatsoever and wheresoever not herein before otherwise disposed of subject to and after payment of my just Debts ffuneral Charges and the Charges of proving this my Will I give and bequeath the same and every part thereof unto my Niece Betty Coles and my Nephew William Nash of Winchester in the County of Southampton Victualler equally to be divided between them share and share alike And I do nominate constitute and appoint the said Thomas Coles and

William Nash Executors of this my Will And Lastly I do hereby revoke all former and other Wills by me at any time heretofore made and do declare this to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I the said Testatrix Mary Lockton have to this my last Will and Testament contained in one sheet of paper wrote on one side only set my hand and seal the twenty second day of September in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen the mark of X
